Welcome to formation for Level II. Before we know it, we will begin exploring God's presence in the life of the 6–9-year-old child. As we reflect on the religious needs and characteristics of the 6–9-year-old, we are sure to grow in our collective sense of wonder with our awareness of the scope and vastness of the kingdom of God and how it is celebrated in liturgy.

Besides RPC II and HKG2 and perhaps LV, you will need to bring your Bible, notebook, and pens. As we are not yet providing meals, you will need to bring your own lunch. A refrigerator will be available for our use.)

You also may want to bring:

- A flash drive, if you have one (a good place to electronically store album pages)
- Power/extension cord for laptop, if needed
- Calligraphy pen(s) and paper (for copying Psalms and prayer cards)

Some general use supplies will be provided, e.g., scissors, colored cardstock, paper cutter, glue sticks, scotch tape, pencils, and soft erasers.

Photography of materials is encouraged. Audiotaping for personal use, if helpful, will be allowed. Videotaping of presentations will not be permissible.

THE NATIONAL CERTIFICATE

This Level II formation is recognized by the U.S. Association of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. The national certificate will be given upon your successful participation in Parts One *and* Two. It acknowledges the amount of time and work you have given to your formation in Level II of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd. Therefore, attendance at every session is essential, not only to receive the certificate but also for your own knowledge and understanding of the 6-9 year old child whom you will be serving.

Successful participation will consist of:

- attending all* sessions of this formation;
- reading all recommended texts associated with themes covered in this formation;
- observing** in a Lower Elementary Montessori classroom (for 6–9-year-olds);
- observing** in a Level II CGS atrium;
- writing album pages in collaboration with other participants in this formation.

*Attendance

Some absences are unavoidable. If you miss one or two days of this Part One, you will need to obtain the missed notes from another participant, read all corresponding texts for the day missed, and receive the missed presentations from an experienced catechist.

Note: If you miss more than two days from this Part One, you will need to obtain the missed components from another Level II formation in order to receive the national certificate (in 2022).

** Observations

Observing in a Level II atrium and in an accredited Lower Elementary Montessori environment are vital for your formation in Level II. The national Office of Formation requires your observation of at least one session (3 hours) in an accredited Lower Elementary Montessori classroom and at least one session in a Level II atrium. However, observing more than once in each environment will allow you to see patterns and consistencies in the children's life in those environments, especially in the religious environment.

Observing in a Lower Elementary Montessori environment also will allow you to see philosophical and pedagogical principles in action with children of the Second Plane of Development.
